

Introduction to IPR

- Every treasure in the society needs to be protected- (human intellect is also a treasure)
- Every kind of intellectual creation in the form of ARTS, LITERATURE, PAINTINGS, MUSIC & CINEMATOGRAPHY are liable to get IP protection.
- The IP owner has an **EXCLUSIVE RIGHT** over his intellectual creation
- Copyright does not aim to prevent others from taking advantage from an original work
- **Why Intellectual property protection?**
- Both tangible and intangible property are to be protected
- Strikes a balance between public & private rights (the creation comes into the public domain at some point)
- High economic significance
- Great incentive to the inventor
